



Good afternoon everyone and welcome to all.

On a personal note it was great to have my parents and three nephews watching the game - it was the first time they had seen us win as well.

So to today and we're facing new opponents in Horndean. They won for the first time in midweek so they will be on a high and we are going to have to right the wrongs in our own performance after Tuesday.

THE OPPOSITION: HORNDEAN FC

Horndean FC was established in 1887 and played their first match on 27 October against Red Star from Havant. They initially played at Blendworth Hill before moving to their current ground.

The club only played friendly matches until World War I, after which they joined the Waterlooville & District League, They won the league title in 1926–27, 1929–30, 1930–31 and 1931–32.

They went on to join the Portsmouth

League, winning Division Two in 1953–54. They were later promoted to the Premier Division, which they won in 1968–69, 1969–70 and 1970–71.

In 1972 they moved up to Division Four of the Hampshire League. By the mid-1980s they had reached Division One, and became founder members of the Wessex League in 1986.

The Deans struggled to make an impact on the league and in nine seasons never once managed to finish in the top half.

After finishing bottom of the league in 1994–95, they were relegated back to the Hampshire League, where they remained until rejoining the Wessex League as founder members of the new Division Two in 2004.

In 2010–11 they were promoted to the Premier Division after finishing as runners-up in Division One.

In October 2015 long serving manager David Carter left the club

and on Wednesday 21 October 2015 Portsmouth Academy Coach Craig Pearce and Simon Chamberlain were appointed as successors. Craig Pearce and Simon Chamberlain took the team to fifth place, Horndean's highest ever position in the Sydenham's Wessex premier league.

At the start of the 2016–2017 season Horndean FC saw the arrival of Michael Birmingham, Dutchy Holland, Jason Manna, and Matthew Driver. The season finished with Horndean

FC in 6th place in the Sydenham's Wessex Premier division.

The 2017-2018 Season saw the first team finish in 4th place, in 2018-2019 the team under Michael Birmingham finished second, its highest ever position in the Sydenham's Wessex premier League. The club were promoted to the Isthmian League for the first time as Champions in the 2022-23 season.

Horndean play their home games at Five Heads Park, Five Heads Road, Horndean PO8 9NZ.

The ground was fully enclosed in 1981. In 1986 a 50-seater stand was added and a new building housing changing rooms and hospitality facilities was constructed inside the ground, to meet Wessex League standards.

Previously the changing rooms had been in the social club, on the other side of the car park. The ground seating was increased significantly during the 2014/2015 season.

Victory over Pitching in Isthmian League Sputh East rivals Herne Bay earned another home tie against National League South Welling United.

New loan signing TT Walters made his debut after joining from Hastings, while youngster Tyrese Osbourne was another new name featuring off the bench. The game was delayed only 45

The game was delayed only 45 seconds after the start when Cory Holder and Sami Takaloo suffered a clash of heads, both needing lengthy treatment.

Takaloo was substituted at half-time and taken to hospital as a precaution, but was released later in the evening. Kieran Cadogan had the night's first chance, seeing his free-kick pushed away by visiting keeper Josh Bexon. Dan Bennett fired over soon afterwards, before putting Oaks in front four minutes later.

Amadou Tangara's long kick found Fumnaya Shomotun, whose pacy run took him to the byline before crossing for Bennett to score.

The tricky winger added the second - his first of the season - 10 minutes later He picked up a poor pass before finishing well with a trademark left footed finish inside Bexon's near post.

Oaks added the third on the hour. Rian Bray headed a corner against the bar, Ricardo Thompson converting the rebound inside the six-yard box. They finished strongly with Cadogan and substitutes Walters and Henry close to adding more in the final 10

Oaks Review:

Fumnaya Shomotun's second half equaliser earned Sevenoaks Town a point in this Pitching In Isthmian League South East draw against Sittingbourne.

Oaks, playing their first league game for a month, trailed twice.

Shomotun's impressive finish 16 minutes from time was his first league goal of the season.

Tightly marked throughout the game, he worked himself a chink of space on the edge of the box, before drilling home a fine left foot finish inside the near post.

Both sides had chances to win the game late on, Bourne seeing one

effort cleared off the line, and another bounce down off the bar, while visiting keeper Bobby Mason made three important saves to deny Oaks' late rally.

Chris Harris put the visitors ahead after 21 minutes, sandwiched between two other close-range far post chances.

Miller-Neave put Oaks level two minutes after the break, with a top corner far post finish, but the lead lasted only seconds, D'Shaun Theobalds hitting Bourne's second in their next attack.

Reaction: Harry Hudson:

"I thought we were second best especially in the first half. I think the mini-15 day break we did not really not go in our favour.

"The positive thing is we came from behind twice and got a point when we weren't playing very well.

"We struggled against Sittingbourne's press which was intense, and weren't good enough or bright enough to see the solutions.

"I felt Sittingbourne looked more likely to get the winner if I'm being honest. There's times when you have got to stick in games when you aren't playing well and accumulate points. "We're still unbeaten at home." He added: "Fum had a really good week, and good on him.

He scored twice in two games - also got two assists against Herne Bay and was our brightest spark in the game."

A first win in three visits secured with second half goals by Dan Carr and Matthew Warren - his first for the club Boss Harry Hudson watched this one from the stands, courtesy of a onematch touchline ban imposed for three yellow cards.

He named an unchanged starting line-up from the home draw against Sittingbourne.

Oaks trailed after six minutes when Lukaz Franzen-Jones fired home after Amadou Tangara palmed away a left wing freekick.

Oaks recovered well from that early setback, Rian Bray' 21st minute header ruled out by the tightest of off sides. Dan Bennett's effort was blocked at the near post by Alieu Secka, before Carr headed over just before the half-hour.

Fumnaya Shomotun was the inspiration

behind a dominant second half performance.

Two minutes in he tricked his way past several defenders before seeing his shot blocked by Secka.

Seven minutes he rounded Secka but again the ball stayed out, and Kieran Cadogan's free kick went inches over. Oaks levelled on the hour - home defenders losing their bearings, and with Secka stranded on the edge of the area, Warren setting up Carr to score into an empty net.

Shomotun's trickery left defenders in his wake creating two more chances in three minutes, Secka saving one - the other being blocked.

Warren's winner came 10 minutes time - Oaks making the most of a poor clearance, Manny Mensah's pass put substitute Rowan Liburd in, his shot was blocked, but touched the rebound to Warren to turn and score left footed past the diving Secka.

Seven minutes added on at the end saw Lancing go close and another substitute Jaiden Drake-Thomas see his effort saved.

Oaks endured a disappointing night on the Kent coast.

Trailing 1-0 at half-time, conceding a second within a minute of the restart added to their problems before Hythe doubled their advantage to move above Oaks in the table

Matty Warren missed the trip due to work commitments with Ricardo Thompson replacing him, while Rowan Liburd started in place of Dan Bennett who dropped to the bench - two changes from the team who won at Lancing.

Oaks best moments came in the first 45 minutes - Kieran Cadogan saw his early free-kick punched clear by home keeper Steve Phillips who then saved from Rowan Liburd.

Hythe went in front after 17 minutes, Aaron Barnes cut inside before shooting inside the near post.

Amadou Tangara then kept out Johan Caney- Bryan's point blank header, before Liburd fired over.

Tangara then punched clear under pressure following a corner as the clock ticked down towards the interval.

Harry Hudson: "I think the performance matched the result - Hythe deserved to win 4-0 on the second half.


