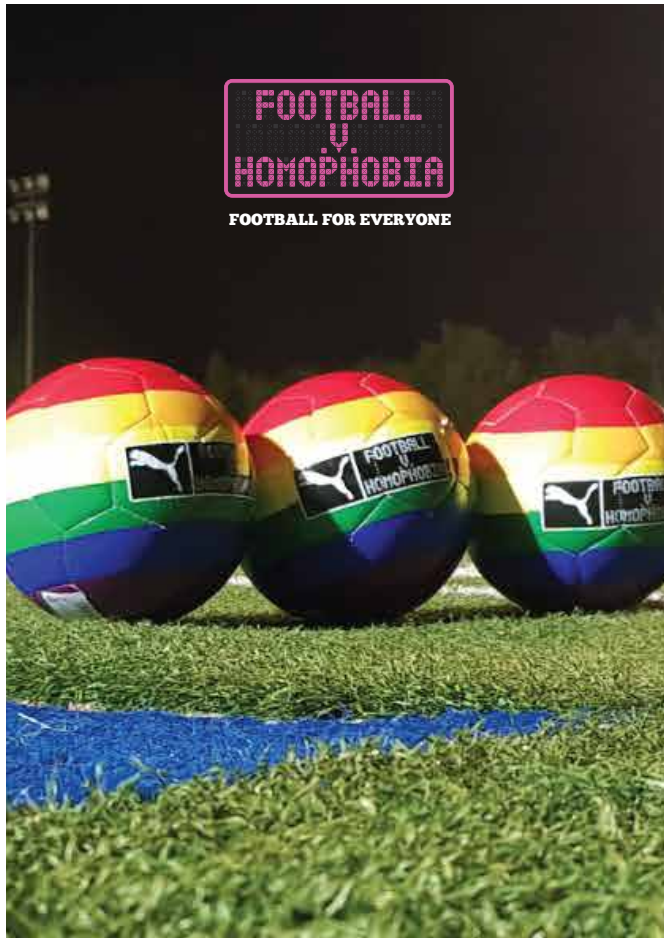

BECKENHAM TOWN FC

The original Beckenham Town were established in the late 19th century, affiliating to the Kent County Football Association in **1887**.

In **1923** the club joined Division One of the London League.

They won Division One in **1927–28** and were promoted to the Premier Division. However, after finishing second-from-bottom in their first season in the Premier Division, they ended the **1929–30** season in last place, and were relegated back to Division One.

The following season saw them finish second in Division One, earning promotion back to the Premier Division. Despite finishing bottom of the Premier Division in **1931–32** they remained in the division, but after repeating the feat in **1932–33**, they were relegated back to Division One.

After finishing bottom of Division One in **1934–35** the club left the league. They had also entered a team into the Kent County Amateur League a few seasons before, and continued playing in the Premier Division of the Western Section until rejoining the London League in **1951**, where they were placed in the Premier Division.

They remained in the London League's Premier Division until joining the Aetolian League in **1961**.

This merged with the London League in **1964** to form the Greater London League, with Beckenham placed in Section B.

A fifth-place finish in the league's inaugural season saw them win a place in the Premier Division for the **1965–66** season. However, after

finishing second-from-bottom of the division that season, they were relegated to Division One. They folded in **1969**.

In **1971** the club was reformed based on the Stanhope Rovers junior team.

After playing in the South East London Amateur League, they joined Division Two of the new London Spartan League in **1975**. After being runners-up in **1977–78**, they were promoted to the Premier Division. In 1982 they transferred to Division One of the Kent League, which became the Premier Division in **1998**.

They finished as runners-up in **2005–06**. The league was subsequently renamed the Southern Counties East League in 2013. The club won both the Kent Senior Trophy and the League Cup in 2013–14, and went on to win the Roy Vinter Shield at the start of the **2014–15** season. In **2019–20** the club were top of the league when the season was abandoned due to the COVID-19 pandemic; this would have been the club's highest finish since reforming in **1971**.

At the end of the **2020–21** season they were transferred to the Premier Division South of the Combined Counties League.

During their first season in the Combined Counties League, Beckenham were Premier Division South champions, earning promotion to the Isthmian League.

In their first season in the Isthmian League the club finished fourth, qualifying for the promotion play-offs. They went on to lose 1–0 to Whitehawk in the semi-finals.

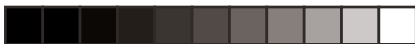

Report: Missed chances proved costly as a 92nd minute penalty caused Sevenoaks' fourth home Pitching In Isthmian League South East defeat of the season.

The game looked to be heading for goalless stalemate before referee David Spain pointed to the spot, penalising Mannie Mensah's challenge on Heath's Matt Penfold.

He was booked for his protests before Sam Lemon stepped up to beat keep Dan Colmer.

Oaks had their own claims turned down soon after the restart when top scorer Dan Carr looked to be pushed in the area attempting to get on the

end of Kieron Cadogan's cross. Earlier Cadogan's effort from the halfway line was tipped over the bar by back pedalling Heath keeper Alfie Hadfield just before the half hour, Jerald Aboagye just failed to get on the end of Corey Holder's free-kick before Mensah missed out to finish one-on-one against Hadfield after good to work to dispossess Heath midfielder James Buchanan high up the pitch. It was the same story soon after the restart.

Jayden Drake-Thomas and Carr fired over, before Dominic Morgan Griffiths' great run into the box lacked a finish. Cadogan fired against the bar - and defender Karn Miller-Neave shot straight at Hadfield inside the final 10 minutes before the late spot-kick proved a real sucker punch.

Reaction

Mark Dacey:

Manager Mark Dacey said: "I didn't think it was a penalty, I thought he (Penfold) unintentionally kicked Mannie. It's disappointing because we had one turned down. Had it been a 0-0 stalemate, I don't think it would have looked too out of place."

"It's two 1-0 losses in a row after two really good home wins. Unless we're going to be clinical, we didn't really deserve too much on the day."

They led 2-0 inside the opening 25 minutes against their Pitching In Isthmian League South East mid-table rivals.

They doubled the lead 12 minutes later, Oaks scoring on the counter, Jayden Drake-Thomas and Ajayi combining in the left - the latter crossing with the outside of his right foot for Dan Bennett to set-up Baugh to score from close-range.

Jacob Lambert pulled one back eight minutes before the break, before

Sheppey went close three times soon after the restart before adding a third - Jack Taylor's long-range strike seeming to take a deflection and wrong foot Oaks keeper Dan Colmer.
