Good afternoon everyone and welcome to the Bourne Stadium for this afternoon's Pitching Isthmian League South East game against Merstham.

We offer the same to their officials, players and supporters, and also extend it to the three match officials appointed for today's game.

It's the first league meeting between the two clubs - having only met previously in the FA Cup.

The main talking point of the past few days has involved Harry leaving the club and Mark Dacey stepping up to take over.

As i said in the statement we were looking for a seamless transition and make it business as usual and have achieved both.

Welcome too to Junior James who joins us as first team coach, replacing Dan Hogan.

It has been only 20 months since Harry and Mark were both appointed



but they were very eventful, beginning with preserving our Step 4 status, and the historic runs in the FA Cup and FA Trophy.

I will never forget 20th February 2022 when we appointed Harry. We had 23 points at the time and were favourites to be relegated. The very next day we had a team of coaches working away on a list of players Harry wanted to recruit.

With only 10 games to go we needed a few wins to stand a chance of staying at Step 4. The following season we had the amazing FA Cup run and FA Trophy as well as finishing 8th in the league.

THE OPPOSITION: MERSTHAM FC

In **1897** Merstham were founder members of the Redhill & District League and playing in Division Two along with our old friends Whyteleafe

The club's first major success was winning the league in 1927. In 1930, the East Surrey Junior Cup was added to the trophy cabinet. In 1935 and 1936, Merstham won the Redhill League Premier Division in consecutive years, a record later repeated in 1950 and 1951. In 1951, the club applied for intermediate status and accepted into the Eastern Section of the Surrey Intermediate League for the 1952–53 season. The move to the new league could hardly have got off to a better start, as the club claimed the title at their first attempt.

Merstham continued to play in the Surrey Intermediate League until they gained senior status in **1964** and joined the Surrey Senior League. In fourteen years in the Surrey Senior League, Merstham managed to win the title just once in 1971-72.

After a spell in the London Spartan League they joined the Combined Counties League in **1984-85** and the 1990-91 season saw the erection of floodlights and an official 'Floodlight Opener' against Crystal Palace, whose side included future England Manager, Gareth Southgate.

The FA Cup of **1996-97** saw Merstham's biggest home defeat when they crashed out in the First Qualifying Round, 1-8 to Aldershot Town.

The **2000-01** season was Merstham's most successful for nearly a decade. They reached the Second Qualifying Round of the FA Cup and finished eighth in the league after being in the top six for most of the season.

Silverware returned to Merstham in the **2004-05** season when they beat AFC Guildford 3-0 in the final of the Premier Challenge Cup and won the East Surrey Hospitals Charity Cup (ESHCC) with a victory over local rivals Redhill.

For the **2006-07** season manager, Mick Sullivan, along with assistants Micky Stratford and Rhys Williams built a team which surpassed expectations as the club enjoyed their best season for 20 years, finishing second in the league and winning the Premier Challenge Cup by beating North Greenford Utd 4-1 in a hard-fought final.

In the league they notched up a fantastic 100 goals, nearly a quarter of which were scored by striker Kwabena Agyei.

Many thought Merstham had peaked, but the **2007–08** season, Mick Sullivan's seventh year in charge, brought the Club into a new era with a treble winning side, a fantastic run in the FA Vase and promotion to the Isthmian League South Division as they finally finished top of the league after two seasons as runners up.

After losing on the opening day of the season at Cove, Merstham went undefeated in the league for the rest of the season winning 35 times, gaining 111 points and scoring 114 goals with Kevin Lock and Kwabena Agyei scoring 53 between them. The dream of a Wembley final in the FA Vase vanished in the Quarter Final when they lost at home to Needham Market 2–3 in extra time in front of a crowd of 841.

With promotion to the Isthmian League South officially confirmed in May 2008, Merstham left behind them many friends after 24 seasons in the Combined Counties League.

The **2008-09** was Merstham's first season in the Isthmian South, finishing eighth, narrowly missing out the play-offs.

However, in May manager Mick Sullivan announced that, after eight seasons at the helm, he was leaving the club for local rivals Leatherhead. Former Banstead boss Graeme Banyard was appointed as the new manager.

The 2014-15 season was to be the best in the club's history to date, gaining pro-

motion to the Isthmian Premier Division by winning the play-offs in style.

The semi-final went to penalties, which Merstham won 5-4 thanks to keeper Brannon Daly making a match-winning save. In front of a crowd of 1465, Merstham gained promotion at Folkestone beating the home side 3-0 with goals from Taurean Roberts, Tutu Henriques and skipper Fabio Saraiva.

The **2015-16** season was to be yet another record-breaking season for Merstham attaining their highest position in the 'Football Pyramid' finishing a very creditable tenth in their first season in The Isthmian Premier League.

In Merstham's second season in the Isthmian Premier, the Moatsiders reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup for the first time in their history.

They achieved this with some of the finest football ever seen at the Moatside; They beat East Preston (4-1), Colliers Wood Utd (2-1 in a replay), Thamesmead Town (5-1) and Ebbsfleet Utd (2-1) on the way to a meeting with League One side Oxford United.

This saw a record-breaking crowd of 1,920 at the Moatside. Although Merstham lost 5-0, the scoreline somewhat flattered the League One side.

In **2017–18** saw the club celebrated its 125th anniversary, finish 12th in the league and for the second time in four years, win the Surrey Senior Cup, beating Leatherhead 3-1.

The **2018-19** was Merstham's best-ever season in the topflight. At Christmas, the side were flirting with relegation, but a superb run saw the Moatsiders put themselves in the hunt for the play offs. They finished the season needing to win away to Worthing to get into the play offs. Amazingly the visitors went 3-0 up inside the first ten minutes and held on for a 4-2 win

In the play-off semi-final, another tough away game at Carshalton saw the Moatsiders shock the Robins with a 2-1 win, which set up a play-off final away to Tonbridge Angels in front of a crowd of 2,400. It turned out to be a physical and rather dour encounter marred by a double sending off just before the interval with Merstham's Ollie Cook given his marching orders. Tonbridge scored on 34' and the Moatsiders rarely looked like getting back

on terms. A penalty in added time was largely irrelevant as the Angels clinched the play-off spot with a 2-0 win.

When football finally returned at the start of the **2021-22** season, the Moatsiders made a decent start in the league and progressed through two rounds of the FA Cup before losing at home to Hereford United. In the FA Trophy, Welwyn Garden City came to the Moatside and caused something of an upset by winning comfortably 3-0.

In November, the team went through a purple patch of form with the front two of Korrey Henry and John Ufuah forming a lethal combination and the team playing some superb football. In the home game against Haringey, Merstham were 5-0 up at the interval!

However, other clubs had taken note and Ufuah departed for the Welsh Premiership and Henry to Carshalton. Without their front two, the Moatsiders struggled to score goals and combined with a horrendous run of injuries that reduced the squad to the bare bones, Merstham began to slide down the table. The team lost their final 13 league games and relegation was confirmed on the final day of the season.

Merstham were one of the favourites for promotion from the Isthmian South Central in 2022-23. However, Peter Adeniyi's young, new team failed to fire and after ten games, the team were bottom of the table and remained there for much of the season.

As the season drew to a close, Merstham were in deep trouble near the bottom. In the final league game of the season at home to Westfield.

After 45 minutes the Moatsiders were 2-0 down and staring relegation in the face. However, a stirring second half display earned them a point with a 2-2 draw, but they could have won it.

It condemned Merstham to a relegation play off against an in-form Egham Town. In front of over 650 spectators, Merstham conceded first and were lucky not to be two down. But on the stroke of half time, Aaron Goode powered home a header to make it 1-1. After the break it was all Merstham and two goals by Adam Adam on 64' and 81' guaranteed the Moatsiders survival.

MERSTHAM FC PROFILES

JAMIE DECRUZ

Manager Jamie started his managerial career at Sutton United where he was first the U18s manager and from there he progressed to the U23s, before gaining experience working with the first team. In 2021, Jamie took the reins at Colliers Wood United. He gave the club their highest finish in 20 years and received considerable praise for who his team played in the two years he was there. In the summer of 2023, he joined Kingstonian as their assistant manager, before accepting the Merstham job at the end of September.

ZACK BASEY

Goalkeeper. Joins us having spent the previous season just up the road at South Park. Highly rated young keeper who is an excellent shot stopper.

ENDURANCE JOHNSON

Goalkeeper. Endurance was at Kingstonian with Jamie Decruz and the Merstham boss was quick to add him to the first team squad. Endurance started his career in Brentford's de-

velopment squad at the age of 15 before signing for Colchester United. He was with the Essex side for three years, signing for Hampton and Richmond Borough at the start of last season. For most of the season Endurance was on loan with Sutton Common Rovers.

DEAN GUNNER

Defender. A commanding central defender with vast experience, Dean was part of the Merstham side that won promotion to the Isthmian Premier in 2014-15 and then did the same with Dorking Wanderers in 2016-17. He spent last season at Haywards Heath, but he has a great deal of experience at this

level, turning out for Three Bridges, Horsham YMCA, Whyteleafe, Greenwich Borough, Chipstead, Sevenoaks and East Grinstead Town.

PETER WEDGEWORTH

Defender. Experienced left back and another former Merstham player. Peter was part of the Merstham side which started the 2019-20 Isthmian Premier season, making eleven appearances. He spent last season at Chipstead, playing twenty-nine times including in a draw against us in November. The full back and free-kick specialist was an important part of Tooting's promotion to the Isthmian Premier Division in 2017.

HARRY POINTING

Defender. A commanding central defender, very comfortable with the ball at his feet. Harry is dual registered with Walton & Hersham and of course Merstham. Moved to the Moatside after Jamie Decruz's arrival from Redhill.

CHARLIE ALEXIOU

Defender. Charlie joined Merstham last season and after a loan spell mid-way through the campaign at Guildford City. He returned to the

Moatside and produced a series of Man of the Match displays as the season went down to the wire. He started at Carshalton's Academy and then joined Loughborough University's highly rated football team.

HARRY MURPHY

Defender. Harry was one of Jamie's first signings from Kingstonian. He joined the K's in the summer, where Jamie was the assistant manager and had previously played for the Gaffer at Colliers Wood United.

MICHAEL ABNETT

Defender. Yet another player returning to the Moatside. Michael was part of the Mer-

stham side that went on its historic run to the First Round of the FA Cup, and was also in the side that went to the Isthmian Premier Play Off Final in the 2018-19 season. Originally a full back, Michael has been playing more as a holding midfielder in pre-season.

CALLUM CORBIN

Midfield. Callum joined us on loan from Bromley. Callum came through the Bromley youth Academy and signed his firstyear professional contract in the summer. The midfielder has been with the club for seven years, played for the first team in pre-season, and is an important part of the Under 21 squad.

LEE QUINCEY

Midfield. Another new signing this season. Lee joins from the Fox Soccer Academy after youth team spells at Gillingham, Walsall and Lincoln. He also appeared for in the Sky TV documentary 'One Shot: The Football Factory'

SAMIR BAJJA

Midfield. A defensive midfielder with good range of passing, Samir joined us from Hungerford in October. He also had spells at Hendon and Leatherhead.

BILLY ORAM

Midfield. One of the new manager's first signings, Billy moved to the Moatside from Isthmian South-Central side Badshot Lea. He has made ten appearances for the Baggies since joining the club in the summer. He was with Jamie at Colliers Wood United last season where he picked up over 30 assists. Previously at Fleet Town, where he played for a number of seasons.

JOSHUA MILLO

Midfield. Joshua was another of Jamie's first signings from Wokingham & Emmbrook, but you might remember him from his time with Walton & Hersham last season. He joined the Swans in September 22 from Sandhurst Town, where he had been prolific, with hat tricks against Hounslow United, Hillingdon Borough and

Deportivo Galizia helping him to a total of fifteen goals in only nine matches.

LEWIS PEARCH
