# THE OPPOSITION: **SHEPPEY UNITED**

#### The 4 Eras of SUFC 1890 - 1992: The Botany Road Era

Sheppey United FC was formed in 1890 by a merger of Sheerness Victoria and Invicta, and initially played at the Sheppey United Cricket Club ground at Botany Road. The first match was at Sittingbourne on 20 September 1890, with Sheppey running out 3-1 winners despite turning up with only ten players. The match report referred to us as 'the Sheppeyites', hence the club nickname 'The ites', which remains to this day.

They were founder members of both the Southern League and the Kent League in 1894. In the Southern League they were placed in Division Two, in which they finished as runners-up in the first season, before losing the promotion/ relegation test match against Clapton 5-1.

The following season they finished second again, and this time won the test match, defeating Royal Ord-

nance Factories 4-2 to earn promotion to Division One. At the end of the season they left the Kent League. The season also saw the club make their debut in the FA Cup when they played Millwall Athletic, but lost 4-0.

In their first season in Division One they finished second bottom of the table, but avoided relegation by defeating RETB Chatham 2-1 in the test matches. In 1898-99 they again finished second bottom of the table but retained their

Division One status after drawing the test match against Thames Ironworks 1–1. However, the following season they finished bottom of the table and lost the test match against Watford 2-1, resulting in relegation back to Division Two.

The club re-joined the Kent League prior to the start of the 1900–01 season, as well as remaining in the Southern League. However, after a single season back in Division Two, the club withdrew from the

> Southern League. In 1905-06 they won the Kent League and repeated the feat the following season. A third title as the first team had re-joined the Southern League for that season and were placed in the English Section. However, after finishing bottom of the league in both they resigned, and League in Division One.



At the end of the 1938-39 season Sheppey finished bottom of the league and should have been relegated, but the league was suspended due to the Second World War. After the war Sheppey were placed back in the top division of the Kent league for the 1945-46 season. The club then remained in Division one until the 1958-59 season when the Kent league stopped.

In 1959 they were founder members of

the Aetolian League, which they played in until it merged with the London League to form the Greater London League in 1964. After winning Section B of the Greater London League in 1964-65, the club joined the Metropolitan League. They had a single season in the Metropolitan-London League in 1971-72 after it was formed by a merger of the Metropolitan League and the Greater London, before re-joining the new Kent League in 1972. They won the title in their first season back in the league and were league champions again in 1974-75 and 1978-79, as well as winning the League Cup in 1975-76 and 1978-79. After finishing second in 1983-84, the club re-joined the Southern League for a third spell. However, after finishing bottom of Division One South in 1989-90 they returned to the Kent League. They finished bottom of the table in their first season back, but a gradual improvement saw them win the league in 1994-95.

#### 1992 - 2013: The Nomadic Years

Sheppey United sold the much-loved Botany Round ground to developers in 1992 to clear a massive overdraft, and this started a long and slow death for the

Initially this did not appear to present too many problems as Sheppey romped away with the Kent League title, whilst ground-sharing with Faversham Town, losing only two out of forty games. Ultimately however, as the club spent most of the 1990s trying in vain to find a new home on the Island, years of playing away from Sheppey began to take its toll, as the club moved from Faversham, to Canterbury, and then to Sittingbourne. Attendances fell sharply as supporters increasingly became disenchanted with traveling off the Island for 'home' games, and the club could no longer afford the rents involved.

In March 2001 the club resigned from the Kent League and their record was expunged. The senior team was disbanded until being reformed in 2003, when they joined Division Two East of the Kent County League. They finished second in their first season and were promoted to Division One East. The club was renamed AFC Sheppey in 2007, but was disbanded

and reformed under their original name prior to the 2010–11 season.

#### 2013 - 2016: The New Club

In June 2013 the club merged with Sheerness East FC to become Sheppey & Sheerness United FC competing in the Kent County League Premier Division with the club playing their home games a Holm Park formerly Canning Town Gasworks and then Sheerness Steel Sports Ground. The season saw the club win the Kent FA Intermediate Challenge Shield and finish runners up in the league and were promoted to the Kent Invicta League.

In the summer of 2014 the club was renamed back to Sheppey United FC. Major investment has been injected into Holm Park including: perimeter fencing, new dressing rooms, club house refurbishments, floodlights, stands, levelling the main pitch including installing drainage and sprinkler system.

A second place finish in the Kent Invicta League was achieved at the end of the 2015/16 season gaining promotion to the Southern Counties East Football League Premier Division. The Kent Invicta League merged into the Southern Counties East Football League that summer forming Division One.

2016 was a remarkable season for the club winning the Kent Senior Trophy, beating Ashford United on penalties at Maidstone United's Gallagher Stadium in front of a crowd of 870, whilst Holm Park's ground regeneration saw 715 fans flock to the stadium for a home match against

## 2016 - Present: The Return of Kent **League Football**

A sixth-place finish in the SCEFL Premier Division was a great achievement in the clubs return to Step 5 of the Non-League pyramid.

The Ites have remained at this level ever since and just last week their FA Cup tie with Walsall was televised live on ITV.

#### Oaks Review:

Harry Hudson lauded skipper Corey Holder for a "colossal" display after Oaks maintained their unbeaten home record with a 1-0 win against Chichester City at the Bourne Stadium.

Goalkeeper Amadou Tangara won the sponsors Man of the Match award on the day after playing his part in frustrating the West Sussex side, as Oaks claimed their first win in seven meetings between the two clubs, but Hudson's vote went to Holder.

Rowan Liburd netted the 11th minute winner, his first goal for the club after a lengthy lay-off following an early season injury.

He was inches away from getting a second later, but Hudson was delighted with the move which led to the eventual winner.

City started quickly and went close twice early on - Tangara saving from Isaac Bello and top scorer Ethan Prichard shooting wide.

The game proved value for money for the 100 plus crowd who braved a wet afternoon with a total of 17 minutes stoppage-time.

Tangara foiled Bello again and Prichard sent a free-kick over the bar. before Manny Mensah missed out in a one-on-one chance against visiting keeper Kieran Magee, as the clock ticked past 45 minutes.

#### HT: 1-0 (90+9)

City pressed and probed throughout the second half as heavy rain contin-

Prichard and striker Steve Hutchings both missed twice, while Oaks defended stoutly - a combination of Tangara's safe hands and resolute defending including several last ditch blocks. Oaks went close to a second again late on, Liburd seeing his effort blocked before Jaiden Drake-Thomas put his follow-up wide.

"I think a clean sheet is a long time coming for Amadou, but he deserved it, everyone did incredibly well. "Corey was out of this world, he would have been my MOM - he won challenges in the box that were 70-30 against him, and it was a massive colossal captain's performance. "Third in the table maybe a fake position as other teams have games to play - inconsistency has been the problem, and we haven't hit the levels we want to vet."

Two changes from the side that beat Chichester - Matty Warren returned after injury with Dan Bennett recalled replacing Manny Mensah and Ricardo Thompson who started on the bench. Latest signing Dominic Morgan Griffiths also returned after returning from Saudis Arabia representing England in the Mini World Cup

Oaks got the midweek monkey off their backs with Dan Bennett's 42nd minute goal clinching the points in the first Step 4 meeting between the old rivals and only eighth in 29 matches stretching back to season 2005-6.

Deres made a rapid start creating chance after chance - a total of 13 efforts on goal in the opening half hour. Fumnaya Shomotun and Warren both created chances before Oaks went in

front, Dan Bennett's flicked near post header converting Jaiden Drake-Thomas' corner.

#### HT: 1-0 (47-28)

Manny Mensah and Dan Carr were introduced and made an immediate impact - Carr hitting the bar with his first touch, Mensah seeing his follow-up pushed away by home keeper Jordan Perrin. Mensah needed lengthy treatment after colliding with the perimeter wall - it looked serious at the time, but he happily recovered - and moments later created another chance, wa strong run ending before shoot-

Amadou Tangara claimed a second successive clean-sheet, kept busy earlier in that quick fire Dere's opening burst.

"He had a quieter second half before producing a last ditch touch over the bar second favourite in a chase for the ball with Josh Ayayi, following a miscued clearance which bounced towards the Oaks goal There was a late sting in the tail when Carr saw red following a challenge as the clocked ticked into seven minutes stoppage-time - but Oaks held firm to win a tight contest.

#### **Reaction: Harry Hudson**

"It was a tough game which we were glad to come out on the right side off. They started better than us and were in the front foot and in the ascendency.

"We started poorly and had to make a change in our structure to stop them getting in to our final third because they were on too

"Once we did that I felt we nullified them, and we got better as the game went on -second half I think we had opportunities to get a second and put the game to bed. "Credit to the boys for making the change in gameand execute it.

"It was a resolute performance, and I felt we were better value for our clean sheet than against Chichester.

"Things were made harder by Dan Carr's red card but I thought our maturity and game management was first class.

"I think he was stopping their counter, there was minimum contact - the referee hasmade the decision and he apologised to the group afterwards."

# THE NLP COLUMN

ALDERSHOT Town is a football club with a pretty unique history.

Reborn in the spring of 1992 after the original Aldershot FC went out of business, the Shots have famously worked their way back up the Non-League pyramid, from Ryman Division Three all the way back into the Football League, where they stayed for five years until their off-the-field misery returned to haunt them. Relegation back to the Conference in May 2013 coincided with the club re-entering administration and from there its been a struggle with the Shots treading water in the top-flight ever since.

In short, it's been a bit of a tough watch at the Recreation Ground (now EBB Stadium) over the years, so you can imagine the elation of the 1,278 hardy supporters who made the trip west to Swindon Town's County Ground last Saturday to watch one of the most bizarre FA Cup ties in the competition's history.

A goal to the good inside a minute, Tommy Widdrington's men scored again three minutes later and added a third after nine.

By half-time, it was 5-0 and within 13 minutes of the second half the lead had stretched to SEVEN, with Jack Barham celebrating his hat-trick goal in front the dis-believing and joyous Shots fans going wild in the stands.

Even late braces from Swindon's Dan Kemp and Charlie Austin, to bring the score back to 7-4, couldn't take the shine off an occasion described by the club's co-founder, former secretary and fan of over 50 years, Graham Brookland, as the "most remarkable afternoon of football he had every experienced".

"It was barm'y," Widdrington told us. "A bit of an unreal situation

"I have nothing but praise for the lads and the people that have come to this game in their hundreds.

"I am delighted for them as I am aware they have had some hard times of late and this is something to remember, it is a scoreline that you can't ignore.

"They players are fully deserving of today because they work so hard."

Aldershot's feat made it on to the front page of The NLP last week, but there were several other notable achievements which were equally as deserved.

Step 4 Ramsgate's march continued with a stunning 2-1 come-from-behind win over National League Woking, while Horsham held League One high-fliers Barnsley in a six-goal thriller at Oakwell on Friday night.

"It's just so pleasing that we can bring them back to our place," said delighted Hornets boss Dom di Paola. We can bring the town out and be allowed to let our supporters actually watch us in such a high-profile game."

And it was the same on Sunday too with Cray Valley Paper Mills winning the hearts of a nation after holding high-profile south-east London neighbours Charlton Athletic to a 1-1 draw at The Valley to become the second Step 4 club to book their place in the second-round draw. A trip to Kent side Gillingham, not a million miles either from Cray Valley's Eltham base, now lies in wait for the winners of a tie which will surely add fuel to the debate surrounding the benefit of FA Cup replays to Non-League sides in particular. National League leaders Chesterfield continued to fly the Non-Leaue flag by knocking out the highest-ranked team in the competition, Portsmouth, while Slough Town went mighty close to dumping Grimsby after player/boss Scott Davies rolled back the years with a stunning 30-yard free-kick.

It was another weekend which showed just why we love the FA Cup with its magic conjuring memories, as the likes of Aldershot, Ramsgate, Horsham and Cray Valley will tell you, that can last a lifetime.
