Skipper Lauren Parsons ensured a perfect start for newly promoted Sevenoaks Women's First Team in their first London and South East Division 1 South game of the season winning 1-0 at Hastings United on Sunday. Manager Dan Thomas looks ahead to the new challenges his team faces after being crowned South East Counties Division 1 champions last season, winning by seven points ahead of runners-up Tonbridge Angels. "We went tough in pre-season, all our opposition were from teams above us. "There will be a lot of travelling across Sussex and Surrey in the new division, which is a big ask for the girls. "They will be training twice a week - in the gym for two hours at our sponsors Slade Fitness on Monday nights, and

there will be a massive commitment required. "We had a debrief before the start of the season, Ben Franks has helped me to set-out to them what we need. "We will have a squad of 22 - not everyone will get a game every week, but there will be holidays, injuries, so it will be interesting. "I sat down with the girls at the end of last season after we won the league - we only lost twice all season - my message then was the commitment levels must go 50% higher. It will be tough." They entertain Frimley Green tomorrow (kick off 3.30pm). Bexhill visit in the opening round of the Womens FA Cup on Sunday September 7.

Not our day" was one fan's view of Oaks' 2-0 opening day Pitching In Isthmian League South East defeat. Oaks were second best in the first half, but better after the break, failing to convert several good chances. Kadell Daniel's first half brace decided the contest, putting the visitors in front after fired 12 minutes, doubling the lead eight minutes before the interval - the 1000th goal since the visitors were formed in 2012. Former Oaks keeper Amadou Tangara denied home debutant Mason Doughty close to half-time, Oaks' first effort on goal. However it was a different story after

the break as Tangara and his defence held out against a much improved Oaks - Tom Hanfrey's delivery from corners proving a constant threat, but no end product. Last season's top scorer Warren Mfula blasted over from three yards, and Josh Wisson saw his effort cleared off the line, before being substituted later after a blow on the head. Mfula and substitute Harry Bunclark couldn't force the ball home after good work by Kevin Diomande, before defenders Tola Jonah and Charlie Dickens headed wide from close range late on.

Substitute Jed Borders came off the bench to inspire Oaks' comeback to earn a late point in the 2-2 draw at Ashford United.

The 18-year-old local boy signed on dual-reg from Bromley replaced Tom Hanfrey just past the hour and made an immediate impact, setting up Warren Mfula to pull one back 12 minutes later.

He then provided the corner met perfectly by ex-Nuts and Bolts man Josh Wisson to level things upon on the stroke of stoppage-time, as the home fans in the 506 crowd headed for the exit confident of victory. Earlier Mfula's shot saw his close-

range effort blocked by on-loan Gillingham keeper Taite Holtam, Charlie Dickens putting the rebound over the bar.

Jefferson Aibangbee facing his old club saw his first half cross bounce off the far stanchion, before Oaks fell behind, allowing Louie Collins to draw first blood for the hosts six minutes before half-time.

Harrison Hume doubled the lead 10 minutes after the break with a far post finish and any reward for Oaks then looked unlikely.

However Borders made the difference and Oaks left with a share of the spoils.

Quite a game.

Oaks led 3-0 on the hour - only for Casuals to score three in 16 minutes - and leave the destiny of the tie in the balance - and thoughts of a midweek replay.

Kevin Diomande made it 4-3 four minutes from time, only for Casuals to crash a free-kick against the bar in stoppage time.

Six and a half minutes were added on at the end, but with time almost up, Oaks broke quickly down the right and substitute Jed Borders' third assist of the week set-up Dan Duncanson for the fifth.

Charlie Dickens headed Oaks in front from Tom Hanfrey's corner, the first of five in the opening 10 minutes, only for Casuals to see one effort ruled out for offside and then hit a post in a lively opening which set the tone for the afternoon.

Tola Jonah made it 2-0 early in the second half, and Mason Doughty added the third six minutes later, his first for the club. Cue Casuals come back - left back George Bond with the best of the three with a left foot "screamer" having gone close with a similar effort earlier.

However Oaks came again to clinch the tie.

Crowborough Athletic

Crowborough Athletic FC, established in 1894 as a sporting extension of the local athletics club, has a fascinating history intertwined with the community. Initially sharing their namewith a cricketing section, the club soon found its footballing identity and joined the Crowborough & District League (CDL) and the Sussex County FA in 1896.

Over the years, Crowborough Athletic FC showcased impressive performances in local leagues and competitions like the Humble-Crofts Cup and the George Dodd Memorial Trophy.

They moved from various locations within the town before settling at the Alderbrook Playing Fields in 1953, thanks to the generous contribution of Mr. George Watson.

The 1970s brought the club to the prestigious Sussex County Football League (SCFL), where they experienced ups and downs but consistently displayed determination. The 2003/04 season marked a turning point, with a promotion to Division 2 and a Division 3 Cup victory.

The subsequent years saw continuous growth, culminating in a historic promotion to the Ryman Isthmian League, Division 1, in the 2007/08 season.

Despite challenges, Crowborough Athletic FC's resilience remained steadfast, and they eventually returned to the SCFL Division 1 after one season in the Ryman Isthmian League.

Their transition to the Southern Counties East Football League (SCEFL) in 2014 introduced new competition, where the club continued to progress.

The 2016/17 season saw an outstanding 32-game unbeaten run, nearly earning promotion to the Ryman Isthmian League. Though they missed out on promotion, the Crows continued their upward trajectory, finishing third in the 2017/18 season.

Amidst challenges in subsequent seasons, including the impact of the global pandemic in 2019/20, the club remained proactive in ensuring the sustainability of football at the Crowborough Community Stadium. Major groundworks and new LED floodlights were installed through grants from the Football Foundation.

In the 2021/22 season, Crowborough Athletic FC focused on developing pathways from youth to senior football, achieving a commendable 10th place finish in the league and reaching the League Cup final. At the end of the season, they were moved back to the Southern Combination Football League (SCFL) by the FA.

In the 2022/23 season, the club continued its progress, finishing 6th and reaching the Peter Bentley Challenge Cup final.

In season 2023/24 further progress resulted in reaching the play-offs (finishing 3rd in league) and again reaching the Peter Bentley Challenge Cup final (losing to a 94th minute winner from the League Champions).

As the 2024/25 season begins, the team is rebuilding as it deals with staff and player retirements, players departing for football at higher levels and players making decisions to improve their circumstances.

None of which is new or unique and the club will continue to set new targets to achieve.
