Sevenoaks Town U18s went out of the FA Youth Cup after a 2-1 Extra Preliminary Round defeat against Sutton Commons Rovers at Whyteleafe.

It was a hard-fought and physical encounter, with Oaks starting strongly, absorbing early pressure from SCR, and looking dangerous on the counter-attack. They dominated possession as the half progressed and Tom Cleary's 18-yard volley forced a save from the SCR keeper. However, clear-cut chances were few and far between, and the sides went into the break level at 0-0.

The second half continued in the same vein, with both teams maintaining high intensity and putting in some crunching tackles.

However, disaster struck when a long ball over the top, which seemed comfortable for Evan Halila to deal with, led to h being injured allowing the SCR striker to take full advantage and slot the ball into the back of the net.

Oaks responded by making tactical changes as the team threw everything forward in search of an equaliser.

They had strong penalty shouts waved away before SCR doubled their lead when their left winger struck the ball in off the near post, the Oaks continued to press Harry Bunclark and Lennon Willow's direct running eventually paid off.

Bunclark was brought down in the box, and substitute Christian Phillips coolly converted the 92nd minute penalty. Oaks thought they had earned another penalty in the dying moments when Bunclark felt contact in the box, but the referee signalled for a corner instead. SCR sat deep to protect their lead, tOaks managed to create some late chances, with Bunclark's last-minute attempt narrowly missing the post.

They can be proud of their performance, and with just a little more time, they might have forced the game to a penalty shoot-out decider.

A quickfire first half double inflicted a first defeat on Marcel Nimani's new side. They struggled to make an against the lively Surrey outfit, with the Oaks boss disappointed in the way they conceded both.

Oaks had their early moments early on but survived themselves when Andre Date rounded Jordan Perrin but skipper Jahmal Howlett-Mundle cleared the danger.

Date put the visitors in front after 18 minutes converting a low left wing cross, before early substitute Marco Haigh thumped home the second after a strong run into the box.Jahmal

Date went close to a third soon afterwards seeing his effort pushed away by Perrin.

Oaks new signing Anthony Adesite saw two efforts blocked in the second half, before substitute Jefferson Aibangbee's low cross created problems - the ball rebounding of visiting player Kwesi Ntim, hitting one post, then pushed away by keeper Sonny Williams, only for Warren Mfula to see effort bounce off the outside of the other.



East Grinstead FC: History

East Grinstead Town Football Club was formed on May 8, 1890, although it was another ten years before they played their first competitive matches as founder members of the Mid

Sussex Football League. In those early days the club played in blue and white with the town's coat of arms on the breast pocket. It was some years before they adopted their current colours of amber and black and were nicknamed 'The Wasps,' both of which survive to this day.

They won the Mid Sussex League in 1902 and their first major honour followed seven years later when they shared the Sussex Junior Cup with Arundel. In 1909 they were awarded senior status which they have held ever since apart from two seasons when they were relegated to the intermediate third division of the Sussex County League in 1989.

In 1912 Grinstead reached the Sussex Senior Cup final for the only time in their history but lost 4-1 to St Leonards Amateurs in a ferocious snowstorm.

The Wasps were original members of the Sussex County League when it was founded in 1920, but they struggled to make any impact and after finishing bottom in 1927 they were not re-elected.

Rather than returning to the Mid Sussex League, they had four successful seasons in the Brighton League before stepping up to the Southern Amateur League. A fresh challenge reinvigorated the club and they won the Division Three title in 1932 with 15 victories out of 18. Three years later they played on the Test match cricket ground at Trent Bridge in Nottingham when they defeated Nottinghamshire Amateurs 6-0 in the old FA Amateur Cup.

Determined to regain their place in the Sussex County League, they were re-elected back in 1937 after winning the Mid Sussex League again and finished fifth in their first season.

In those halcyon days either side of the Second World War, four-figure crowds were the norm at their old ground in West Street, East Grinstead, which they shared with the town's cricketers. The club's record attendance is 2,006 for an FA Amateur Cup tie against Lancing in November 1947.

Success eluded Grinstead until 1952 when they won the Baldwin Cup, the forerunner of the Sussex County League Cup. That team is reckoned by many to be the finest the club has ever produced. It was certainly the most entertaining - 42 games that season in league and cup produced 222 goals!

Grinstead finished third in 1955, but their fortunes began to decline along with crowd numbers after that. They left West Street in 1959 but it wasn't until 1967 that they finally moved to their current home at East Court after a protracted battle to get the ground, which was prone to waterlogging, fit for football. In the meantime, they had a spell at King Georges Field in the town centre.

The club again finished third in 1973 in the Sussex County League but that was as good as it got for another 30 years although Grinstead did reach their first cup final since 1952 when

they lost 4-1 to Haywards Heath in the RUR Cup in 1974 despite taking the lead. During the 1980s the club regularly hosted Crystal Palace and Brighton in charity fixtures watched by crowds of over 2,000.

Wasps found themselves in Division

Two for the first time in 1979 and even had two seasons in Division Three before regaining senior status. They were promoted back to Division One in 1993 but lasted just two years.

Bob Smith, a former player, led Wasps back to Division One in 2003 and they also won their first trophy for 52 years, beating Three Bridges 4-0 in the final of the RUR Cup.

Unfortunately, the club were relegated back to Division Two on the final day of the 2004-05 season and in October 2006 Smith, the long-

est-serving manager in the club's history, was replaced by another ex-player Steve Norris.

In his second season Wasps romped to the Second Division title by a massive 18 points, losing just twice all season. Their winning run of 14 successive league games at the start of the season meant they became

the last senior non-league team in the country to drop points.

The club established itself in the top-flight over the next decade and and their progress on the field has been matched off it.

Floodlights were installed in 1997 and in 2008 two new stands and a pitch perimeter barrier were erected. In 2014 with East Court already meeting the requirements of the Isthmian

Football League after installing additional seating, the club began work on a new dressing room and hospitality area, turnstile block and entrance and a resurfaced car park. More than £225,000 of the cost came from external grant-aid funding.

Simon Funnell's side finished the season in second place, their highest ever County League position, and in May 2014, the club were accepted into the Isthmian League for the first time in our history. In October 2014, Simon was replaced by Tony Beckingham, who returned for a second spell having previously been in charge between February 2010-October 2011. Tony managed to keep the club in the league for a second season despite finishing in 23rd place in the table but left to join Hythe Town in September 2015. Matt Longhurst was appointed manager in October 2015 and consolidated the Wasps at Step 4 for three seasons, despite a big turnover of players. In December

2019, Matt was replaced by the former Kingstonian and Whyteleafe manager Leigh Dynan.

The suspension of the league saved the club from relegation, as they were bottom of the table when Covid-19 forced the curtailment, but Leigh rebuilt the squad and the club began the season with renewed confidence and were fourth when the 2019-

20 season was abandoned because of the pandemic. Leigh had to step down at the start of 2021 due to work commitments and former Wasps' striker Tony Reid, who had enjoyed success with Westfield, was appointed in May 2021 but after a disappointing start to the season Reid left the club in November 2021 and Beckingham returned for a third spell as joint-manager alongside Drew Coonev, who has made more than 400 appearances for the club. Cooney took over as permanent manager in March 2022. The club celebrated ten seasons as a Step 4 club in 2024.

During the summer of 2020 the first major overhaul of the pitch since 2003 took place with new drainage and irrigation installed, most of the cost being met by grants. This project was completed in the summer of 2021.
