



ERITH & BELVEDERE FC

Erith and Belvedere FC celebrated its centenary season in grand style, winning the Southern Counties East league (SCEFL).

They began with a club record 11 league wins from the start of the season and a 9-0 FA Vase win at East Preston which equalled a 100-year-old club record.

At one point the Deres were 23 points clear, but Phoenix Sports had several games in hand and their 17-match unbeaten run narrowed the gap to 2. Unusually the title campaign featured three managers: Tony Beckingham who resigned in December, Andy Constable who left in March, and Matt Longhurst who completed the job.

The Deres were formed in 1922 on the restructuring of Belvedere and District FC, founded in 1918. They played their first Kent League match on 26 August 1922 at Park View, Belvedere, losing 3-1 to Chatham. They reached the FA Amateur Cup quarter-final, and in 1923-24 they reached the Final, losing 3-0 to Clapton at The Den in front of the day's biggest football crowd. In the same season they won the Kent Amateur Cup, and in 1924-25 lost 2-0 at home to Third Division Reading in the FA Cup.

Apart from two seasons (1929-31) in the London League, the Deres remained in the Kent League until the war. In a league featuring many semi-professional and nursery sides, third place in 1928-29 was their highest finish, but greater success came in cups. They reached successive Kent Amateur Cup Finals in 1934/5. The FA Amateur Cup Final was reached again in 1938: although they lost 1-0 to Bromley, again at The Den,

the 33,346 crowd was the biggest ever for a Deres match.

On the outbreak of war the Deres joined the South-East Combination. Since local industry was important to the war effort, Erith lost few players to the Forces, and became one of Kent's top clubs. In 1941-42 they won the Kent Senior Cup (the first amateurs to do so for 30 years) and the South East Combination League and Cup double: they dropped only one point, scored 253 goals in 44 games and had a 64-game unbeaten home run ended only by an Army side fielding four full internationals.

Having won the London Senior Cup on the weekend after VE Day, the Deres were founder members of the Corinthian League, winning the Memorial Shield (League Cup) three seasons in succession (1948-50). Along with Slough and Maidenhead, the Deres remained in the Corinthian League throughout its existence, and in 1963 they joined the Athenian League on its expansion to 3 divisions.

In the late 60s the Deres won the Kent Amateur Cup four times in five years and were runners-up in an international tournament in Belgium! They reached the Athenian premier division in 1971 managed by 1959 Cup Final goalscorer Roy Dwight, and won the League Cup in 1974. Deres chose to return to the Kent League in 1978, but in 1982 entered the Southern League as Kent champions and League Cup finalists, the highlight of Peter Peters' record 17½ years in charge between 1971 and 1991.

Life was hard for the Deres in the





Southern League, with just six tophalf finishes and a best placing of 7th under Harry Richardson in 1993. On his departure Deres struggled until the appointment of Mike Acland in 1996. 18 months into Acland's reign the club could have folded when arsonists destroyed the main stand at Park View on 1 September 1997. The club was based in portakabins for two years before starting a groundshare arrangement with Welling United in **1999.** Acland departed in **2003**, and in 2005 the Deres were relegated, ending a 23-year Southern League stint.

Back in the Kent League, the Deres were in promotion contention until the final day of 2005-06, but were out of the hunt in the following few seasons, apart from a Kent Senior Trophy final defeat to VCD in 2009. Micky Collins took over as manager in May 2010 and won the Kent League double in 2012-13, edging VCD Athletic in an epic title race and beating Corinthian in the League

Cup final.

Collins resigned soon afterwards and 2013-14 was a debut Isthmian season to forget: a 16-game losing streak, 137 goals against and relegation confirmed with 4 games to go. New manager Matt Longhurst took the club to 3rd in the SCEFL and the FA Vase quarter-final (losing to the eventual winners North Shields) in 2015 with 41 goals for Alfie May (now at Charlton). Longhurst departed in autumn 2015, beginning a decline which saw the Deres relegated in 2017. They came back two years later as runners-up in the SCEFL second tier under Owen Jones, winning the London Senior Trophy and with Harry Harding scoring a club record 45 goals in the season. The 2020s began with a turbulent period when the Deres lost a manager, most of the first team and all but two directors. Del Oldfield steadied the ship in the two Covid seasons, before Danny Murphy took Deres to 6th in 2022.

FOOTBALL V HOMOPHOBIA

LGBTIQ+ representation and visibility in football has never been greater – and with that comes an even greater responsibility to tackle discrimination.

That is the message being sent out by Football v Homophobia, marking its 15th annual Month of Action in February 2024.

In what is also LGBT+ History Month in the UK, organisations and individuals are being asked to activate the initiative across their football spaces, such as on the pitch, in the stands, in training sessions, and on social media.

Back in 2010, FvH was launched by The Justin Campaign, named after Justin Fashanu, the first professional player to be publicly out as gay. The call to action in February is linked to his birthday on the

Later extended to a week, and then the whole month, clubs and leagues are encouraged to get involved by showing support on a selected matchday.

Over the years, FvH has held national conferences, run tournaments, delivered education and training, produced resources, surveys and podcasts, partnered on projects, and more.

High-profile figures have lent their voices to the campaign, such as Manchester City legend Vincent Kompany, star of stage and screen Sir Ian McKellen, and Thomas HitzIsperger – the only footballer to have played in the Premier League and come out publicly.

Among the positive developments seen in that time are the rise of the women's game and its many role models; the growth of the LGBTQ+ fan groups movement; the beginnings of out gay and bi representation in men's football; and the creation of more grassroots clubs that are helping gender-diverse people feel welcome and included.

The nature of the fight against discrimination continues to change too, as recent studies have shown.

A report issued by FIFA and players' union FIFPro after the Qatar 2022 World Cup stated that "homophobia was prolific" online around the tournament, while equivalent research after the Women's World Cup in Australia and New Zealand found that "homophobic, sexual and sexist abuse accounted for almost 50% of detected verified abusive messages" sent to players.

At a domestic level in England, three clubs have been fined six-figure sums by the Football Association in recent months as a result of homophobic chanting by sections of their supporters on Premier League matchdays.

Meanwhile, the most recent reporting statistics released by Kick It Out showed reports of discrimination related to sexual orientation were up 58% on the previous year at grassroots level.

To help counter this, FvH has created

'Allies United', a groundbreaking new education programme supported by Just Eat that is delivering LGBTIQ+ inclusive training directly to those taking part in the game outside of the professional tiers.

Crucially, FvH also celebrates the LGBTIQ+ community within football. The FvH Awards gala returns for its fifth edition in Manchester on February 23, and the LGBTQ+ Professionals in Football Collective – an industry network group founded 18 months ago – continues to attract new members. An FvH Youth Panel has been running since 2018.

In addition, Football v Transphobia has its dedicated annual Week of Action in late March, while festival-style event Football Pride is set to return this summer after its success last year.

Lou Englefield, FvH campaign director, said: "So much has changed since 2010. LGBTIQ+ fans are visible across the game, we have a professional network for the football industry and phenomenal growth in representation across football media.

"We need to ensure this momentum continues, particularly during the divisive times in which we now find ourselves."

For the 2024 Month of Action, there is a new version of the iconic FvH rainbow football, in Progress Pride flag colours, as well as other exciting developments in store."

Oaks Review: Oaks led 2-0 through Dan Bennett and MOM Mannie Mensah in the opening half hour - the visitors made it 2-2 in the space of five second half minutes, before Oaks finished with a late flourish with late goals by substitute Dan Carr, his 13th goal of the season, and Kieron Cadogan. The victory was a first home league success for Mark Dacey following four draws and two defeats since he took charge in November. Oaks lost Ajayi to a first half injury soon after the restart, Mensah then saw another effort tipped over the bar by visiting goalkeeper Louis Rogers. Carr's effort was blocked, Bennett firing wide from the follow-up before Lancing's rapid response.

Andrew Briggs curled home from around 30-yards, then skipper Lukas Franzen-Jones levelled things.

Lancing went looking for the win leaving gaps st the back - exploited by Oaks - Carr squeezing home the third despite Rogers getting a hand on it, before Cadogan rounded things off with a neat finish deep into stoppage-time. FT 4-2: 96:15

"It's been a long time coming. We've had quite a few games here that we've drawn and should've got more from. I'm over the moon for the players and the staff who have worked really hard.

"As soon as it went 2-2, Lancing were looking for a third and left spaces - and you are asking for trouble if you leave Dan and Kieron somewhat unopposed.

"We were clever in putting balls into the areas where they can be effective."







